## AEF GENERAL INFORMATION

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1. The 2026 Sparkle into Spring AEF Wild Rose Schooling Competition is sanctioned as an Alberta Equestrian Federation Wild Rose Schooling Competition and will be run in accordance to the AEF Wild Rose Competition Rulebook.
2. Every class offered herein is covered by the rules and specifications of the current Wild Rose Competition Rulebook and will be held and judged in accordance with the Rulebook. It is the rider's responsibility to be familiar with the AEF rules and regulations. They can be found at <https://www.albertaequestrian-events.com/competitions>
3. Every participant at the AEF Wild Rose Competition shall agree that the owner, lessee, trainer, manager, agent, coach, driver or rider, and horse shall be subject to the constitution and rules of the competition. Not all the AEF Rules are listed in the prize list. It is the responsibility of all to know the AEF rules.
4. The competition is required to ensure all athletes, owners, lessees and person(s) responsible for an entry hold a current AEF membership to ensure each entry is protected by their own individual liability coverage. Exceptions: Out-Of-Province competitors are not required to hold AEF membership provided they are members of their respective PTSO and are in good standing. A parent or guardian are not required to have an AEF membership if signing as the person(s) responsible for an entry that is a minor/junior competitor.

## GENERAL INFORMATION

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### 1. ENTRIES & SHOW OFFICE

- a. Entries must be received no later than March 10, 2026, with full payment and signed forms.
- b. There are two ways to enter the show:
  - i. Compete Easy is the show management system for the Sparkle into Spring show. Compete Easy charges a 5.5% processing fee that will be applied to your EAADA Sparkle into Spring entry fee. To enter, please visit: [www.competeeasy.com](http://www.competeeasy.com) and then go to the SHOW section. The show will be live for entries February 20, 2026.
  - ii. If you still wish to mail / email your entry in, you will be charged a mandatory processing fee. See the Fee Schedule for the cost. Scan and email your entry to [showsecretary.eaada@gmail.com](mailto:showsecretary.eaada@gmail.com) and pay by email bank transfer, also to [showsecretary.eaada@gmail.com](mailto:showsecretary.eaada@gmail.com). The password for the email bank transfer should be set to dressage.
- c. If there are any questions about entries, please email [showsecretary.eaada@gmail.com](mailto:showsecretary.eaada@gmail.com).
- d. Late entries may only be accepted at the Organizing Committee's discretion with a late fee as set out in the Fee Schedule.
- e. Entries may be limited. The Organizing Committee reserves the right to refuse entries.
- f. Incomplete entries will not be processed until they are complete. All entries must include payment in full, all release signatures and copies of vaccination certificate.
- g. It is a condition of entry that the Edmonton Area Alberta Dressage Association, the Organizing Committee, The Pointe and the AEF will not be held responsible in any way for damage, injury, or loss to persons, horses or property of spectators or competitors. Entrants must complete the The Pointe waiver, the EAADA Signature and Media Release Form, the EAADA Release Form and the AEF waiver. All forms are below.
- h. All entries must have the signature of the owner or authorized agent and the signature of the person responsible for the horse. Riders will not be allowed to ride without a person responsible signature. Juniors require the signature of a parent or guardian. There should be three (3) signatures on every entry form. You must use the ones attached to this prize list.
- i. Cancellations prior to the March 10 closing date, entrants will have all fees, less the Administration fee, refunded. Cancellations after March 10 and prior to the ride times being published will forfeit all fees unless a veterinary certificate is provided then the class fee and stabling fees will be refunded. Once ride times are published no fees will be refunded.
- j. Show Office – Show Office will be open 1 hour before scheduled start of ride times, to 30 minutes after the last horse competes.
- k. Show correspondence will be handled through e-mail and Compete Easy. Ride times will be posted on the Compete Easy website as soon as they are available (no later than the Thursday before the show). Please provide the correct e-mail address on your entry form.
- l. In the event that the show is cancelled after March 10, 2026 due to extreme weather or other emergency situations (including but not limited to fire, biosecurity event), entrants will forfeit all fees.
- m. Should the facility be locked down due to an extended isolation or quarantine due to a biosecurity event, the cost of additional stabling, shavings and/or hay will be the responsibility of the entrant.

## HORSE WELFARE

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1. All participants shall be bound by the Horse Welfare Code of Conduct.
2. The inhumane treatment of an equine by any individual (competitor, owner, trainer, etc.) will not be tolerated anywhere on the grounds, under any circumstances.
3. Cruelty can be defined as intentionally causing pain or unnecessary discomfort to an equine. The standard by which such conduct will be measured is the determination of cruel, excessive, or inhumane treatment by a reasonable person who is informed and experienced in generally accepted equine training and procedures.
4. Anyone confirmed of abuse will be eliminated or disqualified and reported to the appropriate governing body.

## MEMBERSHIPS, LICENSES AND HORSE REGISTRATION

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1. The competitor, horse owners and the person responsible are require an AEF membership or other Provincial Territorial Sport Organization membership (i.e. HCBC, SHF)

## COACHING

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1. Coaches are not required to have certification or a license for the AEF Wild Rose Schooling Show.
2. Entrants must list their coach on the entry form as per AEF Rules.

## EQUINE VACCINATIONS

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1. All horses attending the Sparkle into Spring shows must have been administered Equine Influenza and Equine Herpes Virus (1&4) vaccinations within 6 months (+21 days grace period) before arrival at the event. No horse shall receive vaccination within 7 days prior to arrival at the event.
2. In the case of a horse that is unable to receive either of the vaccines, a letter from a veterinarian on official letterhead must be provided with the entry form, stating the horse cannot be vaccinated due to medical concerns. At the discretion of competition management, a log of the horse's temperature prior to arrival at the event site or during the event can be requested.
3. You must attach proof of vaccinations with your entry or the letter from a veterinarian as per item #2. Proof must include the horses name as entered, the vaccines administered and the date administered.

## BIOSECURITY

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
BIOSECURITY Bio Security is everyone's responsibility!

1. All horses entering the show grounds must not have been in contact with any sick horses within the last 14 days. They must not exhibit any sign of illness.
2. Please avoid direct and/or indirect contact between horses, especially nose-to-nose contact.
3. **Competitors are required to notify the show office or The Pointe Office at the first sign of illness or elevated temperature. If the show office is closed, the show manager is to be contacted.**

4. Heads up for horses arriving Friday night – The Pointe does not require horses to be vaccinated to use the arena for drop in rides; therefore, take appropriate biosecurity measures with other horses. The stalls are sanitized.

## TIPS TO PROTECT YOUR HORSE AWAY FROM HOME

1. Bring your own tools and water buckets and don't share! 
2. Bring your own grooming and bathing tools. 
3. When filling water buckets do not submerge the hose in the water. 
4. Sanitize your boots before entering your horse's stall after returning from the muck pit. 
5. Make sure your vaccinations are up to date. 



### EQUINE MEDICATION CONTROL AND DRUG TESTING

1. Any horse entered in any class in the AEF Wild Rose Schooling Show, may be selected for equine medication control testing while at the event location.
2. There is no AEF medication Control Fee.

**ARENA LAYOUT**

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## RULES

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1. It is the rider's responsibility to be familiar with all of the AEF rules and regulations. They can be found at <https://www.albertaequestrian-events.com/competitions>
2. The Pointe Facility and Participant Rules apply for this event. They can be found at <https://thepointeag.ca/about/rules-regulations/>
3. Any horse arriving on the competition grounds but not competing (i.e. not riding in a class) will be subject to all applicable rules and regulations and must be assigned a number that must be worn when the horse is outside the stall.
4. The arena will be open between 8:00am to 8:00 pm on Saturday and 8:00 am to a half hour after the last class on Sunday.
5. Participants can use the arena on Friday, but they must pay The Pointe the applicable drop in fees.
6. The show participants are not allowed in the clinic arena during the clinic. Exception: lunging is allowed during the prescribed lunging times. Lunging will be permitted from 8:00 am to 8:30 am and 12:00 pm to 12:30 pm on Saturday and Sunday in the Clinic Area. If there is a conflict between the clinic riders and lunging, the clinic riders will take precedence.
7. All athletes, regardless of age or level of competition, must wear properly fitted and fastened safety approved protective headgear including a chin strap (specified for equestrian sports) at all times when mounted. Protective headgear must be certified under one of the following standards: ASTM (American Society for Testing Materials)/SEI (Safety Equipment Institute, Inc.); BSI/BS EN (British Standards Institution); EN (European Union Standards); AS/NZS (Australian/New Zealand Standards); or CE VG1 01.040 2014-12 (provided they are BSI Kitemarked).
8. It is compulsory for the horse's assigned competition number to be worn by the horse or rider/handler when the horse is outside the stall from the time that the number is issued until the end of the competition so that officials can identify the horse. Riders are responsible for providing their own numbers (i.e.: use their own bridle numbers).
9. Exhibitors must be ready to compete when scheduled. Competitors are responsible for checking their ride times as they may change.
10. Test readers are allowed. You must provide your own reader.
11. Warm-up rings will be open for a half hour before the start of classes. Riding in the competition rings for warm-up is not allowed.
12. Riders will be allowed into the competition ring once the previous rider has saluted at the end of their test. Riders will have a minimum one lap in the competition ring before the bell is rung.

## STABLING AND PARKING

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1. The Pointe Facility and Participant Rules apply for this event. They can be found at <https://thepointeag.ca/about/rules-regulations/>
5. Show stalls are available from 2 pm on Friday March 20 ,2026 (please **do not** arrive before this time) until the end of the Show on Sunday March 22, 2026. See Fee Schedule for prices. Note: If you wish to use the arena, on Friday you are required to pay The Pointe their drop in fee. Heads up for horses arriving Friday night – The Pointe does not require horses to be vaccinated to use the arena for drop in rides; therefore, take appropriate biosecurity measures with other horses. The stalls are sanitized.
2. The Pointe provides overnight security for the barns.
3. Two bags of shavings are included with each stall including tack stalls. Please pre-order extra bedding on your entry form. Shavings can only be purchased from the Pointe. Outside shavings are not allowed.
4. The stall floors are concrete. You can rent a rubber floor mat. See the fee schedule for pricing. Personal

- mats are permitted provided they are free of manure, bedding and soil to reduce biosecurity concerns.
5. The stalls must be cleaned at the end of the show. Stalls are required to be bulked out; however, they are not expected to be thoroughly cleaned or swept. A stall cleaning deposit must be paid with the entry fee. This will be returned after the show if the stall has been cleaned by the people responsible for the horse to satisfaction of The Pointe operational staff. Please ensure that you have the stall checked by The Point operational staff prior to leaving. If you leave and the stall does meet The Point requirements, the stall deposit will not be returned.
  6. Horses must be put in assigned stalls only. No bedding may be removed from unoccupied stalls. No horse will be placed in an unassigned stall without approval from management. Stalls will be assigned at the sole discretion of the Organizing Committee. Note: Special requests (ex: stabling near someone) should be noted on the entry form and will be accommodated at the discretion of the Organizing Committee. Ask sooner rather than later.
  7. The stable area must always be kept clean and aisles unobstructed. Please deposit all manure and hay in manure bins.
  8. Motorhome parking with and without electrical plug-ins is available.
  9. Fire lanes must always be kept clear to allow for emergency vehicles in case of emergency.
  10. Please be courteous when loading and unloading, DO NOT block the entrance to the show barn for any longer than necessary.
  11. Wash racks with cold and hot running water are available.

3. EAADA members who volunteer 3 or more hours in 2026 at ADA events (any chapter) are eligible for 2026 EAADA Education Subsidy. The show is a great way to complete those hours. Other area groups have similar programs, so check them out.

## CLASSES AND PAY TO PLAY

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1. Maximum Tests:
  - a. A horse/athlete combination may compete in four tests per day for EC National, Canadian Pony Club, Eventing, and Western Dressage levels, and three tests per day for all FEI tests.
  - b. When more than one athlete competes on the same horse, the horse may not compete against itself and may not compete in more tests as outlined in a.
  - c. The pay to play time slots are considered a test for the purposes of a.
  - d. Participants who are also in the Carolynne Champigny Youth clinic can only enter one class per

day. Depending on level and scheduling, this could be increased to two classes per day. This decision will be at the discretion of the Organizing Committee.

2. There will be a limited number of 10-minute pay to play time slots offered. Entrants will be able to ride in a dressage ring (no judge) for 10 minutes. A maximum of 2 time slots per horse/rider combination.
3. Please indicate in your entry which test you would like to ride in your TOC classes, and which category you are entering (O, Jr or AA).
4. When entering through Compete Easy be sure to complete your rider profile including your rider status.

## PRIZES AND AWARD INFORMATION

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1. Class ribbons will be distributed in the show office. To 6<sup>th</sup> place.
2. When there is only one horse in a class, ribbons shall be awarded in accordance with the following chart of percentages:  
 1<sup>st</sup>: 63% or higher,  
 2<sup>nd</sup>: 60% to 62.9%,  
 3<sup>rd</sup>: 58% to 59.9.  
 No ribbons or prizes shall be awarded below 3<sup>rd</sup> position.
3. The ribbons will be a selection of eclectic vintage ribbons from other shows.
4. Ties for Class Placings:
  - a. In the case of equality of points the competitor with the highest total of collective marks shall be declared the winner. When collective marks are tied, the horses shall remain tied.
  - b. In the case of an unbreakable tie each horse will remain tied. For example, if three horses were tied for second place, each would receive second place. The next placed horse would receive fifth place.

The following waiver of all claims, release from all liability, assumption of all risks, agreement not to sue and other terms of this agreement are entered into by me (the Participant) with and for the benefit of:

Without limiting the generality of the foregoing, "Equine Activities" includes but is not limited to, competitions, tournaments organized and /or operated by the "Host", riding instruction, coaching and training provided by the "Host" to the Participant.

**Initial each item below after reading and understanding each item:**

I am aware that there are inherent dangers, hazards and risks (collectively "Risks") associated with "Equine Activities" and injuries resulting from these "Risks" are a common occurrence. I am aware that the "Risks" of "Equine Activities" mean those dangerous conditions which are an integral part of "Equine Activities", including but not limited to:
  - (a) the propensity of any equine to behave in ways that may result in injury, harm or death to persons on or around them and to potentially collide with, bite or kick other animals, people or objects;
  - (b) the unpredictability of an equine's reaction to such things as sounds, sudden movement, tremors, vibrations, unfamiliar objects, persons or other animals and hazards such as subsurface objects;
  - (c) the potential for other participants to behave in a negligent manner that may contribute to injury to themselves or others, including failing to act within their abilities to maintain control over an equine.

The person(s) responsible are ultimately responsible for the condition, fitness, and management of the horse and are alone responsible for any act performed by themselves or by any other person with authorized access to the horse in the stables, elsewhere on the grounds, or while the horse is being ridden, driven, or exercised. For adult entries into AEF sanctioned competitions, the PR shall be either the trainer, the owner of the horse, or the competitor who rides or drives the horse during the AEF sanctioned competition. For Junior entries, the PR may be either the trainer, the owner of the horse, or a parent/guardian of the Junior competitor.
