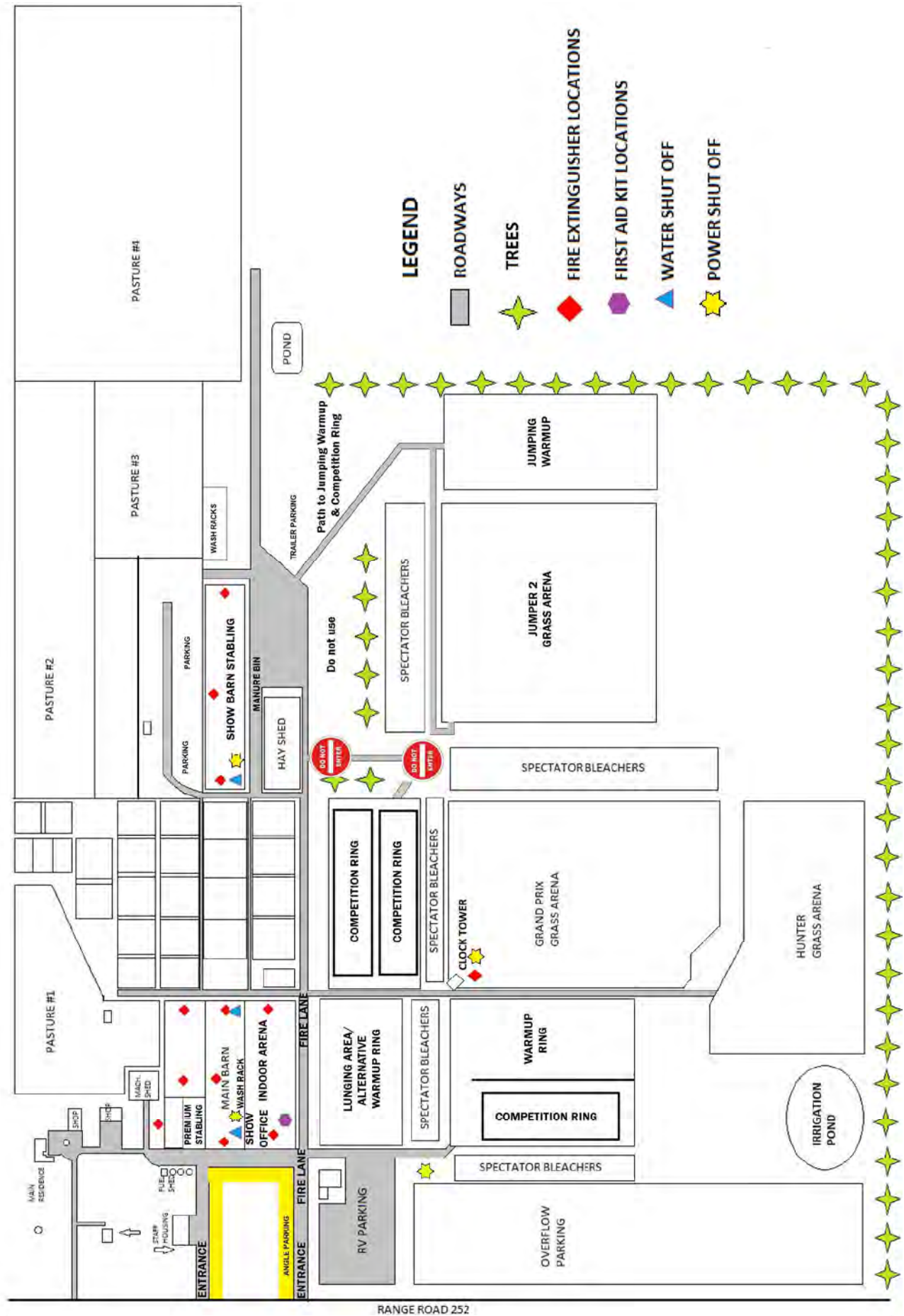

EC GOLD SHOW

EC GENERAL INFORMATION

- a) The 2026 Sparkle & Spurs EC Gold Dressage Show is sanctioned as a Gold competition member of Equestrian Canada c/o House of Sport 2451 Riverside Drive, Ottawa, Ontario, K1H 7X7 and is governed by the Rules of EC (A602.1).
- b) “Every class offered herein is covered by the rules and specifications of the current rules of EC and will be held and judged in accordance with the EC Rule Book (A602.2)”. It is the rider’s responsibility to be familiar with the EC rules and regulations. They can be found at <https://equestrian.ca/compete/athlete-resources/rulebooks/>
- c) “Per Article A801, every entry at an EC-sanctioned competition shall constitute an agreement by the person(s) responsible that the owner, lessee, trainer, manager, agent, coach, driver or rider and horse shall be subject to the EC constitution and all rules of EC and any additional rules set by the competition. It is the responsibility of all individuals participating in any capacity in EC-sanctioned competitions to be knowledgeable regarding the EC constitution and the applicable rules of EC and the additional rules, if any, imposed by the competition. Do not participate in this EC- sanctioned competition in any capacity if you do not consent to be bound by the constitution and rules of EC and any additional rules imposed by the competition. (A602.8)”. Note: Not all the EC Rules are listed in the prize list. As per Article A801, it is the responsibility of all to know the EC rules. Section A – General, and Section E – Dressage and Para-Dressage rulebooks can be found at <https://equestrian.ca/compete/athlete-resources/rulebooks/>
- d) PERSON(S) RESPONSIBLE The Person(s) responsible (PR) for a horse must be an adult who has, or shares responsibility for the care, training, custody, and performance of the horse and who has official responsibility for that horse under EC Rules. The PR is liable under the penalty provisions of the applicable EC Rules for any rule violations. Every entry form for an EC sanctioned competition must identify the PR and be signed by the PR. The Person(s) responsible is ultimately responsible for the condition, fitness and management of the horse and is alone responsible for any act performed by himself/herself or by any other person with authorized access to the horse in the stables, elsewhere on the grounds, or while the horse is being ridden, driven or exercised. For adult entries into EC sanctioned competitions the PR shall be either the trainer, the owner of the horse or the competitor who rides or drives the horse during the EC sanctioned competition. For Junior entries into EC sanctioned competitions the Junior competitor cannot be the PR. For Junior entries the PR may be either the trainer, the owner of the horse, or a parent/guardian of the Junior competitor.
- e) EQUESTRIAN CANADA STATEMENT OF PRINCIPLES – HORSE WELFARE from Section A
 - 1. Equestrian Canada (EC) is committed to fostering a safe and inclusive environment for all participants that is free from Abuse. The purpose of this Policy is to stress the importance of that commitment by educating Individuals and the public about Horse Abuse, outlining how EC will work to prevent Horse Abuse, and how such Abuse or suspected Abuse can be reported to and addressed by EC.
 - 2. EC requires that all Individuals adhere to this Code of Conduct and acknowledge and accept that the welfare of the Horse must always be paramount and must never be subordinated to competitive or commercial influences.
 - 3. Section A Horse Welfare rules apply to all disciplines and all Section Rule Books. Rule exceptions in other Sections that contravene Section A Horse Welfare rules are not permitted and will not be approved.
 - 4. EC is committed to:
 - a. recognizing Horses as sentient beings, defined by the ability to feel, perceive or experience

subjectively. (i.e.. the animal is not only capable of feeling pain and distress but also can have positive psychological experiences, such as comfort, pleasure or interest that are appropriate to its species, environment and circumstances). To state that animals are sentient accepts that they can experience positive and negative emotions.

- b. upholding the welfare of the Horse, regardless of value and performance level, as the primary priority regardless of competitive commitments, expectations, or commercial influences;
- c. requiring the Horse to be treated with the highest level of care, compassion, respect, and empathy;
- d. requiring that no Horse be subjected to Abuse (ref: Rules of Equestrian Canada, Section A General Regulations, Article A517) or Distress;
- e. ensuring that all Individuals accept and implement, at a minimum, the requirements within the National Farm Animal Care Council Equine Code of Practice;
- f. ongoing support for scientific studies of animal-based indicators of pain, Page 1 2026 Rules of Equestrian Canada Section A g. Distress, and/or compromised welfare;
- g. increasing education and awareness for the evolution of best management and equine husbandry practices;
- h. requiring Individuals to know and follow the EC rules and implement industry regulations in all competitions; and,
- i. reviewing, revising, and developing competition rules and regulations that protect the welfare of the horse.

EC GOLD SHOW

GENERAL INFORMATION

1. ENTRIES & SHOW OFFICE

- a. Entries must be received no later than August 3, 2026, with full payment and signed forms. Incomplete entries will not be processed until they are complete.
- b. There are two ways to enter the show:
 - i. Compete Easy is the show management system for the Sparkle & Spurs show. Compete Easy charges a 5.5% processing fee that will be applied to your EAADA Sparkle & Spurs entry fee. To enter, please visit: www.competeeasy.com and then go to the SHOW section. The show will be live for entries July 10, 2026.
 - ii. If you still wish to mail / email your entry in, you will be charged a mail-in fee as well as the Compete Easy Processing fee. See the Fee Schedule for the cost of the mail-in fee. Scan and email your entry to showsecretary.eaada@gmail.com and pay by email bank transfer, also to showsecretary.eaada@gmail.com. The password for the email bank transfer should be set to dressage.
- c. If there are any questions about entries, please email showsecretary.eaada@gmail.com.
- d. Late entries may only be accepted at the Organizing Committee's discretion with a late fee as set out in the Fee Schedule.
- e. Entries may be limited. The Organizing Committee reserves the right to refuse entries (See Article A805 – Refusal or Limitation of Entries)
- f. Cancellations prior to the August 3, 2026, closing date, entrants will have all fees, less the Administration and Compete Easy Processing fee, refunded. Cancellations after August 3 and to prior August 12 will forfeit all fees unless a veterinary certificate is provided then the class fee, EC Levy, EC Drug Fee and ADA Levy will be refunded. After August 11th no fees will be refunded.
- g. Show Office – Show Office will be open 1 hour before scheduled start of ride times, to 30 minutes after the last horse competes. The office will be open on Friday, August 14, 2026, from 2:00 PM to 7:00 PM for check-in.
- h. Show correspondence will be handled through e-mail and Compete Easy. Ride times will be posted on the Compete Easy website as soon as they are available (no later than the Thursday before the show). Please provide the correct e-mail address on your entry form.
- i. In the event that the show is cancelled after August 3, 2026 due to extreme weather or other emergency situations (including but not limited to fire, biosecurity event), entrants will forfeit all fees.
- j. Should the facility be locked down due to an extended isolation or quarantine due to a biosecurity event, the cost of additional stabling, shavings and/or hay will be the responsibility of the entrant.

2. RELEASE FORMS and WAIVERS

It is a condition of entry that the Edmonton Area Alberta Dressage Association, the Organizing Committee, Amberlea Meadows and the AEF will not be held responsible in any way for damage, injury, or loss to persons, horses or property of spectators or competitors. Entrants must complete the EAADA Release Form and the AEF waiver. All forms are attached. Entries are not considered complete without these signed forms.

3. MEDIA RELEASE FORM

All entries must have a completed Media Release Form attached. Entries are not considered complete without this signed form.

4. SIGNATURE FORM

All entries must have a completed Signature Form attached. All entries must have the signature of the rider, owner and the signature of the person responsible for the horse. Juniors require the signature of a parent or

guardian. Entries are not considered complete without this signed form

5. WARM UP AND LUNGEING

- a. Warm-up in the show rings is allowed on Friday August 14, 2026, from 1:00 pm to 8:00 pm. Horses that are not stabled on the grounds may also haul in on Friday and school in the rings.
- b. On Saturday and Sunday, warm-up rings will be open for one hour before the start of classes each day and for one hour at the end of classes each day.
- c. Warm-up in the competition rings is not allowed on Saturday or Sunday.
- d. Lungeing will be allowed in a designated area if space permits.

6. STABLING

- a. Stabling is mandatory.
- b. Show stalls are available from noon on Friday 14, 2026 (please **do not** arrive before this time) until the end of the Show on Sunday August 16, 2026. See Fee Schedule for prices.
- c. There is a limited amount of premium stabling in the main barn. It will be allocated on a first-entered basis.
- d. Five bags of shavings are included with each stall (excluding tack stalls). Please pre-order extra bedding on your entry form.
- e. Horses must be put in assigned stalls only. No bedding may be removed from unoccupied stalls. No horse will be placed in an unassigned stall without approval from management. Stalls will be assigned at the sole discretion of the Organizing Committee. Note: Special requests (ex: stabling near someone) should be noted on the entry form and will be accommodated at the discretion of the Organizing Committee. Ask sooner rather than later.
- f. No smoking in the barn or hayshed.
- g. The stable area must always be kept clean and aisles unobstructed. Please deposit all manure and hay in manure bins.
- h. Absolutely no use of nails in Tack Stalls.
- i. All fans in the show barns must be unplugged by 9pm.

7. PARKING (VEHICLE/HORSE TRAILER/MOTORHOME)

- a. Motorhome parking with electrical plug-ins is available to the south of the arena (No unplugged, unpaid for units in this area). Due to limited power, electrical hook-ups directly at the Show Barn are not permitted.
- b. No motorhomes, trailers or vehicles with propane tanks may park within 50 feet of any building to avoid the risk of fire damage from a propane explosion.
- c. Parking is not allowed on any lawn areas.
- d. The fire lane (see facility map) must always be kept clear to allow for emergency vehicles in case of emergency.
- e. General parking for vehicles is available in front of the indoor arena or at the back on the north side of the show barn.
- f. Please be courteous when loading and unloading, DO NOT block the entrance to the show barn (west end) for any longer than necessary. You can also unload on the north side through the centre aisle.

8. WASH RACKS

Wash racks with cold running water are available on the east end of the show barn. There are wash racks in the main barn with hot and cold running water.

9. FOOD TRUCK

There will be a food truck on site on Saturday and Sunday.

EC GOLD SHOW HORSE WELFARE

1. The inhumane treatment of an equine by any individual (competitor, owner, trainer, etc.) will not be tolerated anywhere on the grounds, under any circumstances. (EC A517.1)
2. EC requires that all Individuals adhere to the Horse Welfare Code of Conduct and acknowledge that the welfare of the Horse must always be paramount and must never be subordinated to competitive or commercial influences. (EC A517.2)
3. The standard by which conduct or treatment will be measured is that which a reasonable person, informed and experienced in generally accepted equine practices, would determine to be cruel, abusive or inhumane. (A517.3.c)
4. Anyone confirmed of abuse will be eliminated or disqualified and reported to the appropriate governing body.

EC GOLD SHOW WARNING CARD

1. A Recorded Warning may be issued by a Judge, Steward, or Technical Delegate at a competition to any person for minor offenses, including behaviour that should not be repeated and that does not warrant a more severe penalty (see Yellow Warning Card).
2. A Yellow Warning Card may be issued to any individual sport license holder at an EC-sanctioned competition for improper conduct or noncompliance with EC rule, when the misconduct is not a minor offense but not severe enough to warrant formal disciplinary action by EC. These violations include but are not limited to the following:
 - a. an individual does not leave the field of play without delay after elimination or at the end of a round;
 - b. an individual does not follow the directives of the organizing committee;
 - c. an individual intentionally touches an obstacle with the effect of changing it;
 - d. an individual does not follow the directives of EC officials;
 - e. an individual exhibits disrespectful or inappropriate behavior towards EC or event officials or any other party connected with the event (Athlete, FEI employee or representative, journalist, member of the public, etc.);
 - f. an individual repeats an offense after a verbal warning to desist or a Recorded Warning; or
 - g. an individual disregards the rules regarding dress and saddlery. Elsewhere in the EC rules certain additional conduct may result in an EC Recorded Warning or Yellow Warning Card being issued.

EC GOLD SHOW MEDIA PASS FOR PROFESSIONAL PHOTOGRAPHERS

1. Professional Photographers other than the official Show Photographer must have a Media Pass. Please contact the Competition Manager to apply for a pass.
2. Professional photographers are required to wear a media vest while on the show grounds. They can be picked up in the show office and are to be returned to the office prior to the end of the show.

EC SPORT LICENSING 2026

SAFETY, INCLUSIVITY, & EXCELLENCE

Your guide to the latest updates for the competition season in Canada

IMPORTANT CHANGES have been implemented to enhance the safety and inclusivity of equestrian sport. Whether you're an athlete, parent, coach, official, or competition staff, your role is crucial in upholding these standards. Here's what you need to know:

SAFE SPORT TRAINING PREREQUISITE:

- The two free EC Safe Sport training modules must be completed before purchasing a Sport Licence. Check your training status on MyEC by clicking on the ECampus button.

DISCONTINUED TEMPORARY LICENCES AND TEMPORARY HORSE REGISTRATIONS:

- Temporary EC Sport Licences are now discontinued at competitions. All riders, owners, and coaches must possess an EC Sport Licence to participate in events. All horses must have a Horse Recording where level and division require.

AVAILABLE SHOW LEVEL UPGRADES:

- Explore higher-level competitions with temporary upgrades via your MyEC Portal. Note: National Rankings Points are not tabulated for upgraded results.

COACH STATUS REMINDER—2026 SEASON

- Coaches attending EC-Sanctioned competition must hold a valid Licensed Coach Status. Any Coach with Registered Coach Status must purchase a Single Event Upgrade for \$55.00. This purchase can be made through the My EC account.
- Coaches without a valid Licensed Coach Status or Registered Coach Status with Single Event Upgrade Status are not eligible to be represented as a coach at EC-Sanctioned events and may be subject to fines. Please complete your requirements in advance to avoid any fines and delays.

DECLARE YOURSELF A SELF-COACHED ATHLETE

- Athletes without a coach on-site can declare themselves as self-coached by entering their own **EC SPORT LICENSE NUMBER** or enter "self-coached" in the **COACH FIELD** on their registration/entry form.
- Please note: Coaches that **DO NOT ATTEND** the events **SHOULD NOT BE LISTED** on the entry form.

EC GOLD SHOW

MEMBERSHIPS, LICENSES AND HORSE REGISTRATION

1. An EC Gold Sport License (or higher) is required for residents of Canada who are competitors, owners or lessees, and individuals accepting legal responsibility for an entry in EC-sanctioned competitions. (EC A203.5)
2. Competitors from other countries must be members in good standing of their national federation, which is a federation recognized by the FEI. (A801.7)
3. Owners or lessees, Persons Responsible and competitors who hold valid Sport Licence, but at a lower level than required, may purchase Single Event Sport Licence Upgrades directly from EC. Upgrades may be obtained for Silver or Gold competitions. (A211.1).
4. Canadian horses competing in the EC Gold Dressage Show are required to hold an EC Horse Recording and have paid the EC Horse Recording annual activation fee to compete . Foreign entries must sign an affidavit (SeeA404). (A602.4)
5. Para-Dressage classes will be offered as part of the Sparkle and Spurs Gold Dressage Show. Riders must submit copies of their EC Para Dressage Dispensation Certificate and, or a copy of the EC Classification Master List with their entries and always carry copies with them while on the competition grounds. (E6.2.7).

EC GOLD SHOW

COACHING STATUS

1. When registering for the EC Gold Show, athletes must indicate the name of their coach on the entry form or specify that they are self-coached. Coaches from other countries, must be in good-standing with their home federation and must declare/have proof of insurance. See Rules of Equestrian Canada, Section A, General Regulations, Article 102, Safe Sport Environments. (A602.10)
2. COACH STATUS REQUIREMENTS: All coaches at EC-sanctioned events require a EC Licence Coach or a Registered Coach License. There are no Temporary Coach Licenses available as of December 31st, 2025.
3. EC Coaches are required to wear a lanyard indicating they are a coach. The lanyards can be picked up in the show office.

EC GOLD SHOW

EQUINE VACCINATIONS

1. All horses attending Equestrian Canada sanctioned competitions must have met the requirements of Article A519, Vaccinations. See Rules of Equestrian Canada, Section A, General Regulations, Article A519, Vaccinations. (A602.9)
2. All horses attending the Sparkle and Spurs dressage shows must have been administered Equine Influenza and Equine Herpes Virus (1&4) vaccinations within 6 months (+21 days grace period) before arrival at the event. No horse shall receive vaccination within 7 days prior to arrival at the event. Horses not compliant with this rule may be asked to leave the event site at the discretion of Competition Management. Competition management may request supporting documentation confirming a horse's compliance with mandatory vaccination requirements.
3. In the case of a horse that is unable to receive either of the vaccines, a letter from a veterinarian on official letterhead must be provided with the entry form, stating the horse cannot be vaccinated due to medical concerns. At the discretion of competition management, a log of the horse's temperature prior to arrival at the event site or during the event can be requested.

4. You must attach proof of vaccinations with your entry or the letter from a veterinarian as per item #3. Proof of vaccination must include the horse's name as entered in the show, vaccines administered, and date administered.

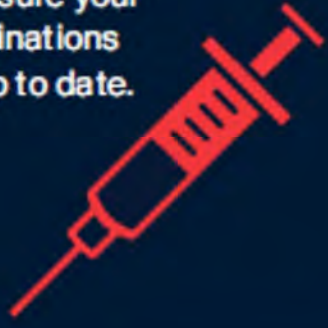
AMBERLEA BIOSECURITY

BIOSECURITY Bio Security is everyone's responsibility!

Amberlea Meadows is committed to providing a safe and healthy environment for all exhibitors and their horses. All show participants are requested to practice good disease prevention practices. Travelling and showing horses are at an increased risk for spreading and contracting contagious diseases. To provide a safe environment, the following measures must be adhered to:

1. Entries that do not have proof of vaccinations (Influenza/EHV1-4) as per the Equine Vaccination Section of the prize list will not be accepted.
2. All horses entering the show grounds must not have been in contact with any sick horses within the last 14 days. They must not exhibit any sign of illness.
3. All horses coming on to the grounds must have a copy of valid Equine Influenza and EHV vaccinations (vaccinations must be administered within the last 6 months, but not within 7 days of arrival to the grounds). Proof of vaccination must be signed by a vet, on vet letterhead. The name on the vaccination MUST MATCH the name on the entry to be acceptable. Please have certificate records available upon request from Amberlea Meadows Staff.
4. In the case of a horse that is unable to receive either of the vaccinations due to a history of adverse reactions, the exhibitor must provide a letter from the veterinarian on official letterhead stating that the horse in question cannot be vaccinated due to medical concerns. The name on the letter MUST MATCH the name on the entry to be acceptable. Please have the letter available upon request from Amberlea Meadows Staff. Additionally, a log of temperatures taken twice daily for the seven days prior to entering the competition grounds must be available upon request from the Amberlea Staff.
5. All horses on the grounds must have their temperatures taken and recorded twice daily. Please have temperature records available upon request from Amberlea Meadows Staff.
6. Please avoid direct and/or indirect contact between horses, especially nose-to-nose contact.
7. **Competitors are required to notify the show office at the first sign of illness or elevated temperature. If the show office is closed, the competition manager is to be contacted. The show organizers and Amberlea will enact the Bio Security Sick Horse Protocol to minimize the risk to other horses.**

TIPS TO PROTECT YOUR HORSE AWAY FROM HOME

1 Bring your own tools and water buckets and don't share! 	2 Bring your own grooming and bathing tools. 
3 When filling water buckets do not submerge the hose in the water. 	5 Make sure your vaccinations are up to date. 
4 Sanitize your boots before entering your horse's stall after returning from the muck pit. 	

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EC GOLD SHOW

EQUINE MEDICATION CONTROL AND DRUG TESTING

1. Any horse entered in any class in the EC Gold Dressage Show may be selected for equine medication control testing while at the event location.
2. The EC medication Control Fee is listed in the show Fee Schedule.

EC GOLD SHOW

CANADIAN ANTI-DOPING PROGRAM

Any athlete at an EC sanctioned competition may be selected for human anti-doping as outlined in the Canadian Anti-Doping Program (CADP) and administered by Sport Integrity Canada. Please see EC General Regulations Section A - Appendix A1, Policy on Human Medications for details.

EC GOLD SHOW

RULES

1. All riders, including those riding in Western Dressage classes, while mounted, regardless of age or level of competition, must wear a properly fitted and fastened approved equestrian safety protective headgear (including a chin strap) at all times when mounted. Protective headgear must be certified under one of the following standards: ASTM (American Society for Testing Materials)/SEI (Safety Page 91 2026 Rules of Equestrian Canada Section A Equipment Institute, Inc.); BSI/BS EN (British Standards Institution); EN (European Union Standards); AS/NZS (Australian/New Zealand Standards); or CE VG1 01.040 2014-12 (provided they are BSI Kitemarked)
2. All competitors must report to the stewards immediately after their class is finished for a mandatory tack check. Athletes must report, still mounted, to the steward or his/her representative for a tack check immediately upon leaving the competition arena. The athlete may not remove any equipment or clothing before the steward has conducted his/her inspection. Exception: An athlete may, of course, dismount and remove their hat and jacket in the case of illness or feeling faint. A rider who is eliminated must still report to the steward.
3. Exhibitors must be ready to compete when scheduled.
4. It is compulsory for the horse's assigned competition number to be worn by the horse or rider/handler when the horse is outside the stall from the time that the number is issued until the end of the competition so that officials can identify the horse. Exception: Horses stabled permanently on the competition site are exempt unless competing.
Failure to display this number will incur a recorded warning for the first offence and, in the case of second or subsequent offences, possible elimination or disqualification at the discretion of the ground jury.
5. Any horse arriving on the competition grounds but not competing (i.e. not riding in a class) will be subject to all applicable rules and regulations and must be assigned a number that must be worn when the horse is outside the stall. Exception: Horses stabled permanently on the competition site are exempt unless they are competing.
6. Non-competing (Hors Concours) horses will be accepted to ride in a class.
 - a. Hors concours entries are not eligible for prizes, placings or awards.
 - b. Such entries must pay the full entry fee and are subject to all applicable rules and regulations.
 - c. A horse may be ridden both as an hors concours entry and a competitive entry at the same competition. The maximum number of tests ridden whether competitive or not is governed by the Classes section of this prize list.
 - d. An hors concours entry in a freestyle must have qualified to ride the freestyle.
 - e. It does not matter in what order the hors concours and competitive tests are ridden as long as the horse/rider combination only competes in one category. No cross entering between Amateur/Junior and Open is allowed having ridden hors concours.
 - f. Hors concours entries are not permitted in championship competitions.
7. Horse substitutions for horses already entered in the show may be allowed until two hours before the class the horse is competing in provided the horse is eligible to enter. Changes will be allowed at the discretion of the Organizing Committee, and if accepted, will be charged a change fee as stated in the Fee

Schedule section. The name of the horse, any required licenses, and owner and person responsible signatures must be given to the show secretary at the time the substitution request is made. Note: When qualifying criteria apply to a horse/athlete combination entered in a class, no substitution of horse or athlete may be made.

8. Horses substitutions, for horses not entered in the show, may be allowed provide 12 hour notification is given and no later than 7pm the previous day. Changes will be allowed at the discretion of the Organizing Committee, and if accepted, will be charged a change fee as stated in the Fee Schedule section. The name of the horse, any required licenses, and owner and person responsible signatures must be given to the show secretary at the time the substitution request is made. Note: When qualifying criteria apply to a horse/athlete combination entered in a class, no substitution of horse or athlete may be made.
9. Rider substitutions for riders already entered may be allowed until two hours before the class the horse is competing in provided the athlete is eligible to enter. Changes will be allowed at the discretion of the Organizing Committee, and if accepted, will be charged a change fee as stated in the Fee Schedule section. The name of the athlete, any required licenses, and owner and person responsible signatures must be given to the show secretary at the time the substitution is made. Note: When qualifying criteria apply to a horse/athlete combination entered in a class, no substitution of horse or athlete may be made.
10. Rider substitutions for riders not entered in the show may be allowed provide 12 hour notification is given and no later than 7pm the previous day. Changes will be allowed at the discretion of the Organizing Committee, and if accepted, will be charged a change fee as stated in the Fee Schedule section. Note: When qualifying criteria apply to a horse/athlete combination entered in a class, no substitution of horse or athlete may be made.
11. Class changes will be allowed at the discretion of the Organizing Committee, and if accepted, will be charged a change fee as stated in the Fee Schedule section.
12. Test readers are allowed, excluding FEI classes and Freestyles. You must provide your own reader.
13. Riders are responsible for providing their own numbers (i.e.: use their own bridle numbers).
14. Competitors are responsible for checking their ride times as they may change. Remember, your time is when you ride down centerline, not making your loop of the ring. The Organizing committee will keep changes to a minimum.
15. Open fires are not allowed on the grounds.
16. Do not ride or graze your horse on the front lawn.
17. Dogs must be kept on leash, please pick up after your dog.
18. Horses exhibiting heat stress are to be given priority to the wash bays for cooling purposes.
19. Hand sanitizers have been installed in the horse barns. Everyone entering or exiting the stabling areas must use hand sanitizers. Either those provided or their own.

 - a. EC Third, Fourth
 - b. FEI Eventing CCI 3* and above
 - c. WDAA Western Dressage level 4 and above,
 - d. FEI Para Dressage Grade III, IV, V
 - e. Prix Caprilli tests

a rider/horse combination may compete in any 2, but only 2, consecutive levels/divisions and up to a maximum of 2 tests per day including the freestyle.

- c. For classes at the FEI Young Rider, FEI Prix St. George, FEI Intermediate I, FEI Intermediate II, FEI Intermediate A, FEI Intermediate B, FEI Grand Prix U25, FEI Grand Prix levels - a rider/horse combination may compete in a maximum of 1 test per day including the freestyle. In-hand classes are exempt from this rule. Exception: Rider/horse combinations competing in the FEI Young Rider division may compete in an FEI Young Rider Freestyle test in addition to one FEI Young Rider technical test per day.
- d. When more than one athlete competes on the same horse, the horse may not compete against itself and may not compete in more tests as stated in a. through c. above.

2. EC E3.9 EQUIVALENCIES – EC/FEI

- a. All FEI Pony Rider and FEI Children's Tests are similar to Second Level
- b. All FEI Junior Rider Tests are similar to Third Level
- c. All FEI Young Rider Tests are similar to Prix St. Georges
- d. The FEI 4-Year-Old Test is similar to First Level
- e. The FEI 5-Year-Old Test is similar to Second Level
- f. The FEI 6-Year-Old Test is similar to Third Level
- g. The FEI 7-Year-Old Tests are similar to Fourth Level

- 5. Masters Test of Choice (E14) class will be offered as part of the EC Gold Dressage Show. The Masters Test of Choice Class is an EC dressage class that provides senior riders, 60 years and older, the opportunity to participate in a dressage class that is exclusively their own that provides a fair playing field for senior riders wherein each will compete against their peers at all levels of skill, from beginners to advanced. Please review EC rules for the list of accommodations available. Masters riders may also compete in non-Masters dressage classes. The maximum number of tests must comply with Item 1.
- 6. Please indicate in your entry which test you would like to ride in your TOC class, and which category you are entering (O, Jr, or AA).
- 7. When entering through Compete Easy be sure to complete your rider profile including rider status.
- 8. The EC Gold Show will offer a fun class called Hoofin'. The Hoofin' It class is not rated for EC awards.

EC GOLD SHOW FREESTYLES

1. Freestyle eligibility for riders in EC Gold Show (EC 10.2):
 - a. Rider/horse combinations must have obtained a minimum score of 60% in a technical test at the same technical level, or a higher technical level, as the freestyle they wish to enter.
 - b. The score may have been obtained at prior competition or may be obtained at the same competition in which they wish to enter the freestyle.
 - c. Technical scores earned at Silver competitions count toward being allowed to enter a freestyle in a Gold competition and vice versa.
2. The athlete must provide the show organizer with a functioning copy of their freestyle music on a USB stick **OR** email your music to showsecretary.eaada@gmail.com with rider name, name of horse, and level of freestyle. If emailing please do so ahead of time (send before 9pm on Thursday August 13, 2026) and confirm with the show organizer that they have your music. If providing a USB, please give to show organizer at check-in.
3. Competitors are responsible for doing a sound check with the announcer Saturday at noon.
4. Your EC Gold Show Freestyle score can be used for the EC Gold Freestyle Championship, provided a technical test is ridden as well.

Alberta Dressage Association Ranking List

The ADA has a ranking list for 2026 based on scores received at EC Gold & Platinum Shows in the Province.

Awards will be presented at the annual Awards Gala to the top-ranked horse/rider combination. See the ADA/AEF website for more information

EC GOLD SHOW PRIZES AND AWARD INFORMATION

1. Class ribbons for the EC Gold will be distributed at the show office. Class ribbons will be given to 6th place by category of rider (Open, Amateur, Junior).
2. The organizing committee has the authority to combine divisions (O, JR, AA) within a class if there are less than 3 entries.
3. Individual placings and ties: in all competitions the winner is the rider having the highest total points, the second is the one with the next highest total points and so on. In the case of equality of points the rider with the highest total of collective marks shall be declared the winner. When collective marks are tied, the horses shall remain tied. (E9.7.6) For example, if three horses were tied for second place, each would receive second place. The next placed horse would receive fifth place. (E9.7.8)
4. For freestyle classes - In the case of a tie, the higher total for artistic impression will break the tie. (E10.6.3.1.3)
5. Any rider/horse combination receiving less than 50% of the total points obtainable in a test shall not be eligible for championship awards, ribbons, prizes or titles. (E7.7)
6. Junior and Adult Ride with Respect Awards – Sponsored by Duraguard Fencing. (includes competitors from all 2026 Sparkle and Spurs Shows)
A nomination form will be in each rider bag. Nominate someone based on one of the 7 principles below and return the completed form to the show office. A draw will be made from the nomination received for the Junior and Adult True Sport Award winners.

a. EAADA Jan Simmonds Junior High Point Award - \$200 Sponsored by Deb Meraw



Criteria: Awarded by the EAADA for the highest average of 2 scores for a Junior rider from the Sparkle & Spurs Gold Show. Scores must be from the same level and must be technical tests only. No Young horse tests. Competitors are considered a Junior if they are 18 years of age or less or, if they have turned 18 during the current competition season, they may still compete as a junior rider.

Jan was instrumental in the development of the Alberta Dressage Association. She was president of ADA for many years and a past chairperson of the ADA's annual casino fundraiser. She is also a cherished past president of the EAADA and could always be found doing multiple volunteer tasks at Edmonton dressage shows, often scribing and preparing gift baskets for the judges. She orchestrated the club's merchandising program and, with her artistic skills, created the beautiful EAADA logo which remains a proud symbol that embodies the love Jan has for the club, and the sport she loves. She also contributed to the EAADA Newsletter and the organization of educational sessions.

She was awarded an EAADA "Lifetime Membership" for her dedication to the sport of dressage and the area group. Jan embodies the true spirit of volunteerism. Nationally, Jan managed group memberships for USDF for interested dressage people. Jan was honored by being chosen the Equestrian Canada Dressage Volunteer of the Month for June 2017. A Personal Note: Jan is also a dedicated horsewoman. In December 2016 she lost Sky, her beloved equine partner of 36 years.

b. EAADA Award for Adult Amateurs in Memory of Karen Harries - \$125 Sponsored by Lloydminster Animal Hospital



Criteria: Awarded by the EAADA for the highest average of 2 scores for an Adult Amateur rider from the Sparkle & Spurs Gold Show. Scores must be from the same level and must be technical tests only. No Young horse tests.

Competitors must have the Adult Amateur designation on their Equestrian Canada Sports License to be eligible.

Karen Duncan Harries (November 16, 1953 – November 7, 2013) Karen was born in Edmonton. In the '70s while Karen was teaching in Quebec, she decided to take riding lessons along with a friend. That triggered her lasting enthusiasm for riding. She returned to Edmonton where she taught in junior and senior high schools and began to take riding lessons at Amberlea Meadows on lesson horses.

Karen became active in the dressage world, helping with the organizing of clinics and shows, writing as a scribe for the judges, and serving for several years on the EA/ADA executive. She continued to ride horses that, were available, took lessons, and attended clinics.

Karen became a horse owner. She loved riding – it gave her the exercise she needed and freedom from the cares and stresses of life beyond the horse world. Her horses were willing and kind but unfortunately each one developed medical issues.

In 2013, while riding her own new mare, Karen succumbed to injuries sustained while enjoying her favorite pastime.

c. EAADA Open Award in Memory of Colin Crone - \$125 Sponsored by Power Performance Horses



Criteria: Awarded by EAADA for the highest average of 2 scores for an Open rider from the Sparkle & Spurs Gold Show. Scores must be from the same level and must be technical tests only. No Young horse tests.

Colin Crone (July 1, 1933 – July 3, 2008)

In 1988, Colin bought Killerney Farms (formerly Tom Budd's, Abbey Stables and Hubbard Stables) and combined the stable and his construction company into Killerney Group.

Shortly afterwards, Colin entered the dressage scene, donating his facility for his first EAADA Wild Rose Schooling Show on July 7, 1990, (20 horses entered) and he continued to do so almost every year until 2008. In December 1990, he reported to the EAADA executive the progress of meetings planning the fate of the Whitemud Equine Centre. In 1991 he put on his first Killerney Stables Dressage Show.

Colin made a lasting impact with our dressage community and that is why the Edmonton Area Alberta Dressage Association continues to honor his memory and dedication to the sport of dressage.

d. EAADA FEI Para Dressage Award - \$125 Sponsored by Sheri Dumonceaux, author of "Jester Goes to the Olympics"

Criteria: Awarded by the EAADA for the highest average of 2 scores for a FEI para dressage rider from the Sparkle & Spurs EC Gold Show. Scores must be from the same level.

e. EAADA FEI Award - \$200 Sponsored by Foxtail Woods Ltd.

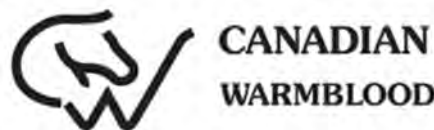

4. For FEI Young Horse 5, 6 and 7 yr old, the 2 tests must be preliminary (Saturday) and final (Sunday), and for the FEI 4 yr old the test must be ridden on Saturday and Sunday to qualify.
5. The organizing committee has the authority to combine divisions (O, JR, AA) within a championship if there are less than 3 entries
6. Freestyle champions will be determined by totaling the higher percentage from the two technical classes (of the same levels/divisions) plus the percentage from the freestyle. In the event that a competitor has only one technical score then the mark from the completed technical test plus the freestyle mark will be used to determine the competitor's placing.
7. On no account may a competition division or level championship be determined by the results of one class. (E9.8.2)
8. In event of a tie, the competitor with the highest single percentage score will be declared the winner. (EC E9.8.5) For freestyle classes, in the case of a tie, the higher total for artistic impression will break the tie. (EC E10.6.3.1.3)
8. Freestyle scores will not count towards technical championships.
9. Any rider/horse combination receiving less than 50% of the total points obtainable in a test shall not be eligible for championship awards, ribbons, prizes or titles. (EC E7.7)
10. There will be no championship presentations for the EC Gold Show. Champions will have their picture taken in the show office. Please come in show attire.

BIOSECURITY REQUIREMENT

see Amberlea Biosecurity Section of the prize list for full details.

You must take and log the temperature of your horse twice a day while on the show grounds.

You must provide a copy of the log when requested.

You must have a copy of your vaccine certificate or exemption letter.

You must provide a copy of the certificate or letter when requested.

Horses that have exemption letters must provide a log of temperatures for the 7 days prior to the show when requested.

You must report any horse with an elevated temperature to the show office. If the show office is closed, contact the Competition Manager. The show organizers and Amberlea will enact the Bio Security – Sick Horse Protocol.

HEAT STRESS IN EQUINES

The most important means of dissipating heat for a horse is the evaporation of sweat. Therefore, humidity can become a more significant consideration than temperature.

Prevention of heat stress/stroke:

- Pre-cool equines by hosing them to lower demands on the equine's cooling systems while they work.
- Abbreviate warm-up times.
- After exercise, cool the equine by hosing with cold water, place in shaded area, use fans on the equine,
- Encourage hydration of the equine with cool, clean water and electrolytes.

Signs of equine heat stress/stroke may include the following:

- High Temperature 41-43C (105-107F)
- Rapid breathing/rapid pulse
- Stumbling, weakness, depression
- Refusal to eat or work
- Dry skin and dehydration.
- In severe cases, an equine may collapse or go into convulsions or a coma

Treatment for heat stress/stroke:

- Call a veterinarian
- Run cold water over the entire body of the equine. May need to be hosed with 2 hoses for 20 to minutes.
- Place the equine in the shade, preferably in a grassy area and not on pavement or dark-coloured ground.
- If there is no breeze, use a fan
- Allow the equine to drink water to offset dehydration.
- Electrolytes may also be given orally.

AIR QUALITY AND EQUINES

Competitors should monitor their equines closely and retire from competition if symptoms of respiratory distress occur. This is particularly competitors with high-risk equines. High-risk equines include older and younger equines and equines with pre-existing respiratory conditions.

Common Signs of Respiratory Distress

- Respiratory rate remaining over 30 breaths per minute at rest (normal rate is 12-20 per minute).
- Shortness of breath with possible wheezing sounds.
- Nostrils obviously flaring and anxious expression.
- Very labored breathing with exaggerated movement of chest wall and flanks.
- Possible repetitive, deep cough.
- Possible nasal discharge.

Call the on-call vet if you suspect an equine is experiencing respiratory distress. Or their own vet.
